Sermon Scripture: John 13:21 – 32 (GNT)

Message Title: Perpetrating a Fraud!

Current Context:

- One of the reasons that our children, millennials, and Generation Z-ers are detaching from church and organized religion is because we have lived a **fraudulent** faith in their faces every day.
- They have watched us claim to <u>love</u> each other but hear us talking about our fellow church members, our brothers and sisters with regularity.
- The truth is that we must be willing to face the pain of life because with no pain there's no **power!**
- Your pain is where you get your **power** from.
- The church is not a for-profit business prioritizing the **bottom line**, but we must be about God's business that convicts us to be **broad lights**!
- Jesus, in the text, is visibly emotional, as He must confront the is-ness of His present **reality**.
- The text says He is **troubled** in His Spirit; meaning the writer saw something in Jesus that caused Him to record His emotional condition...the pain of being Himself!
- Jesus refused to perpetrate a **<u>fraud</u>**.
- And when you are willing to be the you God made you, you can <u>stand</u> with strength and you can face whatever you have to face with dignity and with your <u>head</u> lifted up!

Relevant Question:

How do I avoid fraudulent faith?

Sermon Observations:

- 1. You must be willing to face **inconvenient truths**!
- 2. If you face <u>inconvenient truths</u>, then you'll be able to overcome <u>impending trouble!</u>
- 3. As a result (Of observations 1 and 2), you'll develop an **inspiring testimony**!

Calvary Connection:

- What's your testimony?
- Jesus faced His <u>truth</u> in the Garden of Gethsemane; He faced <u>trouble</u> at His trial; <u>trouble</u> in His conviction; <u>trouble</u> on that Friday; <u>trouble</u> when they nailed Him to a tree! He faced <u>trouble</u> and died on Friday! But early on Sunday morning, He got up with an <u>inspiring testimony</u>... "I have all power!"
