Family, I am requesting that during the month of February, you collaborate with us in a **February Freedom Fast!** We are asking that you make a commitment to abstain from something that will be a sacrifice for you. A list of potential fasting considerations is below.

Our purpose for this collective spiritual action is to help prepare us to truly be an Acts 2 church that utilizes our Ephesians 6 tools, the whole armor of God to deal with the principalities and powers that are antithetical to the message of love that Jesus offers to us. Additionally, Faithful First Family, we will be fasting certainly to re-center our focus on our Creator, seeking His covering and care in this new season in our lives and ministry.

Hampton, VA Black History Fact

Aberdeen Gardens (Hampton, Va)

Located in Hampton, Virginia, Aberdeen Gardens is the first community built by Black people for Black people as part of President Franklin D. Roosevelt's New Deal in 1934-1937 following the Great Depression. It was initiated by Hampton Institute with homes designed by Howard University architect Hilyard R. Robinson. The streets, excepting Aberdeen Road, are named for prominent Black people. The 158 single homes were built on 440 acres.
